

Lord, you are our help and our shield.

Jesus was born in troubled times and from birth was the subject of suspicion. He had been sent by His Father to establish the Kingdom of God among all the nations of the earth for all time. Jesus experienced rejection especially from the hypocritical authorities as he went about teaching, preaching and caring for those in need. It was the Pharisees, the Scribes, the Elders of the people and the Herodians (descendants of Herod) who were plotting and planning to catch Jesus out. They were all concerned about Jesus' popularity and the growing numbers of supporters. It was rumoured that the general population wanted to make Jesus their King. Later these same people accused Jesus of blasphemy. "If you are the son of God come down from the Cross." (Matt 15:20). In today's Gospel we see that Jesus knew that every word was being scrutinised. His enemies were waiting to catch him out. Jesus was aware of their plot and hypocrisy and turned all this back on them. "You hypocrites. Why do you set this trap for me?



Let me see the money you pay the tax with. Whose head is this? Whose name?" "Caesar's, they replied. "Very well; give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar - and to God what belongs to God". The Gospel ending is as follows. 'This reply took them by surprise and they left him alone and went away.' Reflect for a moment on the fact that we belong to God who created us. He chose us, loves us, and we belong to Him; He dwells within us. We are made in the image and likeness of God. IMAGE AND LIKENESS?? God wants to reign in our hearts. Our Father-may your kingdom come! Where do we find signs and wonders? Primarily in the Sacred scriptures, the Word of God and the holy and sacred presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. This Divine Presence is the source and summit of our faith. (Vat 11.)

You may realise by now that it is Mission Sunday. What makes this a significant day is the fact that we are reminded about the spiritual and material generosity of discipleship which is expressed and lived out in many parts of the world by today's missionaries giving their all for the sake of the Kingdom of God. Let us pray for those missionaries who have come to our shores particularly here to Tasmania. Let us be generous in our giving and support for the needs of our Church giving thanks for God's goodness to us "The most missionary and thorough Christian thing we can do is to look redeemed and happy." (Pope Francis) "Joy is the most infallible sign of the presence of God." (Teilhard de Chardin.)




