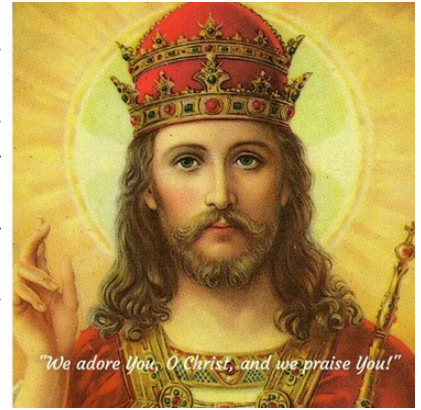

CHRIST THE KING

"The Christ be all in all'. Rejoice, our Redemption is near at hand. At every Mass the word of God is present in the scripture readings, the homily, the congregation gathered and the blessed sacrament of the Eucharist. As partakers of and sharers in these divine mysteries of our faith we as pilgrims are blessed and encouraged to respond to the power of the Holy Spirit living and active in each individual person and as the family of God, - the Mystical Body of Jesus Christ. Among us the Kingdom of God is very real, alive and active, but not yet complete? When the Kingdom of God is completed here on earth St. Matthew tells us in 24: 31 that God will send his angels with a loud trumpet to gather his chosen people from the four winds; from one end of heaven to the other. Yes, we are looking forward to Christ's second coming at the end of time and we often pray; "I believe in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. Amen."



In the meantime How do we live in helping the Kingdom of God to be established ? The three readings from sacred scripture for today's solemn feast of Christ the King, seem to have a common theme of God's promise of salvation for all people. I've written some adaptations from the first reading which comes from Ezekiel (OT) 34:11-12 15-17) which gives us a litany of the promises made by God. The Lord says this; I myself will look after and tend my sheep: I will rescue them: I will pasture them: I myself will give them rest: I will seek out the lost: I will bring back those who have strayed: I will bind up the injured: I will heal the sick: Through the prophet Ezekiel, God has proclaimed his covenant of redemption for all creation - for all human beings especially the needy, past, present and to come.

Jesus said, 'The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice'. I know them and they follow me. (Jn 10: 27) If we are to follow Jesus then we do as Jesus did. How intimately do we know Jesus? He is already present in every person we meet each day and it is by our actions, thoughts and words that we reveal Christ's presence in us. We too, like Christ can feed the hungry, relieve thirst, clothe the naked, give hospitality to strangers, comfort the sick and visit those in prison. These are practical ways we can minister to those who are in need of our support. No doubt we could add to the above list. If we say we love God and know God's love for each individual then we realise to love God and our neighbour - who is often unknown - is necessary for our own salvation. During the penitential rite of the Mass we pray "I confess to Almighty God and to you my brothers and sisters that I have greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my word, in what I have done and in what I have FAILED TO DO!" It will be our individual selves who will be our own judge as we stand before our loving God in eternity. Our positive response to every need that comes our way will be richly rewarded with eternal joy in the Kingdom of God. Lord, help us to be genuine and generous in our response to those in need, for your glory and the salvation of the world. Amen.

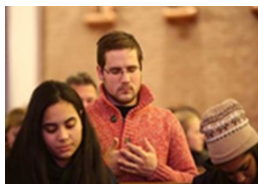

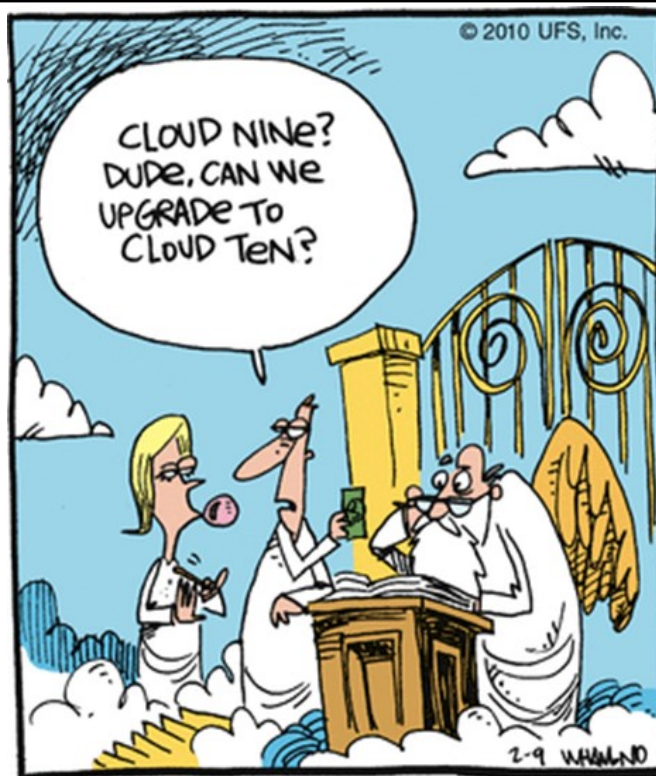
