GOSPEL: (Mt 25:1-13)

Five of them were foolish and five of them were sensible: the foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said, "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'

ISRAELITE'S NOTION ON MARRIAGE: It is said that marriage during Jesus' time in Israel has two steps to consider. The first is the so-called erusin. This is equivalent to betrothalwhen parental arrangements were legally ratified. At this stage, the girl still lives in her family at home... Thus after a year she would be formally taken to her husband's family with the special celebration (nesuin). This is (second part) the actual wedding celebration which described in our gospel. However, marriage here is considered patrilocal; that is, the bride was moved to the groom's home. The groom, accompanied by his relatives and sisters, would go to the house of the bride to fetch her. And so, the ten virgins in our gospel is somewhat similar to this situation. waiting eagerly and patiently for the groom and the party to return...their jobs were to wait, greet them and participate with this special celebration. Moreover, in our gospel parable, the clever virgins are well prepared for their role when the groom arrives. While the dull-witted is not clever and insensitive to the whims of the bridegroom...In our liturgy, the parable is applied to our waiting for the glorious coming of Christ, the BRIDEGROOM. We are told to be prepared, patient and be clever in our role as people entrusted by the Lord with important responsibilities. It is simply a call to be steadfast in faith and patient in suffering even though we are beset with problems, anguish, disappointments, pain and loneliness. God's blessings surely come...
