GOSPEL: (Mt.22:1-14)

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He dispatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out onto the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." REFLECTION FR. LEO

Drighton Condy

Our gospel passage gives us a hint that many people today who prided themselves as the chosen people of God but refused to accept Jesus' teachings and God's blessings sent thru Jesus His Son is tantamount to refusal of God's invitation, generosity and blessing.

The KING WAS ENRAGED: in the middle east, one of the considered cultural values of honour and shame reign supreme. In our gospel today, God is being presented by Jesus as KING deserving of the highest honour from his subjects. The king shows himself to be overly generous in bestowing honour to other. In those times the few who get invited to the royal wedding feast are considered the most honourable in society. To turn down the royal initiation is a grave insult, and the king is justified in punishing those who have put him to shame. Indeed, God invites everyone of us daily to do His will and come to His presence. Thus, we in turn refuse to accept Him, ignore Him and consequently don't mind His teachings. We turn our back from Him and follow our personal whim. Moreover, our gospel passage gives us a hint that many people/Jews who prided themselves as the chosen people of God but refused to accept Jesus' teachings and God's blessings sent thru Jesus His Son is tantamount to refusal of God's invitation, generosity and blessing. God extends His blessing instead to the gentiles who accept His teaching despite of the idea that gentiles are not worthy of being called people of God. And so, accepting God's offer of salvation in Christ opens to us honourable life as His people that gives glory to God.
