The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans." SECOND READING: (1 Thes. 1:5-10)

GOSPEL: (Matthew 22:34-40)

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: you must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'

REFLECTION

Fr. Leo

Indeed, Jesus makes a point of departure that the greatest commandment of God is: To love God and our neighbor in need ... (Deuteronomy 6:5).

When Pharisees heard how Jesus silenced the Sadducees. they again made a question to Jesus: "which is the greatest of all commandments." Indeed, this is a very hard question. This is on the account of the fact that the Pharisees (rabbi or teachers of the Law) know that there are at least 613 basic laws or commandments which are exclusively contained in the Torah (first five books of the bible). And there are still many laws need to know...That is why, becoming scholar of the law entails the idea that one should know the said commandments, memorize them and always remember them since they are really essentials. Indeed, this is really hard to remember. But Jesus reminds us to learn the most important one. Moreover, they test and ask Jesus. They ask Jesus if He is really clever and a real rabbi. Jesus simply cites what is written in the book of Deuteronomy 6:5 as the greatest law: Hear O Israel, you shall love the Lord with all your hearts and with all your souls and with all your strength...which in fact, the Jews recite daily. This is the basic Mosaic Law. Since the Lord alone is God, all must love Him with undivided heart. Moreover, the second commandment is stated in the Book of Leviticus 19:18, you shall love your neighbor as yourself. Jesus means that this love must comprise not only the Israelites but everybody, especially those in need. We have this beautiful passage which is stated in the Gospel of St. Luke 10:29-33. The Good Samaritan. It depicts the reality of the importance of loving our neighbor. We have also in (Mt.7:12, Do to others whatever you would have them do to you). Jesus, in this context, attaches the second with equal putting in the first commandment. And so, Jesus makes a point of departure what the greatest commandment of God is: To love God and our neighbor in need ...
